	are also several smaller houses located on the property near the main house. Those houses combined contain 7-8 other sleeping areas, along with full baths.
	advised Ms. Shaffer that Mr. Burger was the project lead and had coordinated the travel and accommodations for the trip, which was also validated by the witnesses who also participated in the Horseshoe Ranch project. Some of the other individuals who participated on the project were a US Fish and Wildlife employee (male), supervisor. Sharon Lashway (female) and another Region VI employee, Dana Warnecke (female). Informed Ms. Shaffer that she was lead to believe by Mr. Burger that all the project participants would be sleeping in the main house. Mr. Burger told that they would have to sleep in the same room because he did not want to share a room with the USFW employee, who she assumed he was also staying in the house. However, Ms. Lashway and Ms. Warnecke each stayed in their own smaller house and the USFW employee stayed in another house, leaving and Mr. Burger as the only two occupants in the house. Witnesses also confirmed that Ms. Lashway had one house, Ms. Warnecke had another as did the US Fish and Wildlife employee.
	stated that on the first night, nothing happened. She had a long day and went to sleep along with Mr. Burger in the same room, but in separate beds. The second night, states that Bill Burger walked around in his boxer shorts (underwear), came over and sat on her bed, playing with her earring. He also made her uncomfortable by asking her questions, such as, "what is your sexual orientation," and he also asked her for a hug. The same scenario occurred the next night.  from the Horseshoe Ranch property, Bill asked if she would have dinner with him, maybe they could smoke some pot and have a drink.  excuse and told him that she was not available.
	Ms. Shaffer asked Ranch, ever asked her why she was staying in the house with Mr. Burger or suggested that she stay with her and Ms. Warnecke in one of the smaller houses.  Ms. Lashway nor Ms. Warnecke ever said anything to her about the situation.  assumes that they probably thought she was sleeping in a separate bedroom.  stated that she did not say anything because she did not want to make waves.  she told her boyfriend and her best friend and they were both appalled and angry, especially her boyfriend about what had occurred.  employee (non-supervisor) when they spent some time working on a separate project.  stated that told her that he felt Mr. Burger's behavior was inappropriate and that she should tell Ms. Lashway.  of other advances Mr. Burger has made.
The state of the s	Approximately four weeks after the Horseshoe Ranch trip, I did tell Ms. Lashway and asked her what the protocol was for these types of issues. Sharon told that she was not sure, so Ms. Lashway advised her that she would not be assigned to anymore trips with Mr. Burger and to keep her distance from him feels that she did not receive clear direction from Ms. Lashway. After discussion with Ms. Lashway, she stated that Mr. Burger continued to come up to her while they were in the office and make comments regarding getting together. would either not reply or avoid answering his questions. stated that she did not want to seem rude, so she did not tell him to stop.
	advised Ms. Shaffer that it was an uncomfortable situation, that she is a student, trying to learn and did not want to jeopardize future employment. Other than Mr. Burger and the incident at Horseshoe Ranch, states that she enjoyed her internship and learned

a lot. Ms. Shaffer asked if would consider another internship with the Department and she stated that she would like that, but that she would not work with Mr. Burger again.
On September 27, 2016, Lucy Mailloux Human Resource Manager III – ADOA Shared Services also contacted and during their conversation stated:
At Horseshoe Ranch she and Bill were in the same room and that the 2 <sup>nd</sup> room     romained empty for the entire time of the trip.
<ul> <li>When they first showed up, Dana Warnecke was setting up the work for the day and Mr. Burger and were carrying personal items from the car to the living room. stated that at first Bill agreed to split up into separate rooms and while she was trying to decide which room to take, Mr. Burger recommended that she sleep in the room with him since he did not want to share a room with from USFW as he did not like him.</li> </ul>
2 <sup>nd</sup> night, and Bill got into their sleeping bags (on the bed), she was fully clothed (pajamas). There are multiple lights in the room, but dimmed to very low lighting. States that at first he walked over to her bunk inside of his sleeping bag, then when he reached her bed, he let the sleeping bags drop to the floor and he was in his boxer shorts. He continued to talk to her and then he finally asked her to give him a hug in what she felt was an intimate manner.
NOTE: At this point during the conversation with Ms. Mailloux, became very emotional and stated to cry. We took a brief break and we were able to resume.
3 <sup>rd</sup> night states that Mr. Burger started talking to her about religion and then moved the conversation to asking her about her sexual orientation.
Last day - on the way home stated that she was hungry and Mr. Burger suggested they have dinner together and she agreed, picking a place that was close to her home. He paid for her dinner despite her insisting that they split the bill and stated that Mr. Burger then said, "I'm not always going to pay." felt that Bill was trying to be dominate with her. After dinner, Mr. Burger dropped her off, asked if he could help her get the stuff to her door which he did and then asked for a hug.
states that her body language was standoffish in hopes that he would leave her alone. She was very tired at the end of each day of the project due to early mornings and not finishing up for the day until late evening, but that Mr. Burger kept trying to talk to her 2-3 hours after they went to bed.
After the project he texted her and asked her to come over for dinner and that Mr. Burger was persistent in trying to get her to go out with him. Go out and play darts, for

On 9/26/2016 Jay Cook issued a Notice of Administrative Investigation to Bill Burger informing him of the allegations of inappropriate touching and comments that were filed against him.				
On September 28, 2016, Lucy Mailloux interviewed Bill Burger at which time he stated:  He and bid sleep in the same room the entire time during the trip, while the other room remainder empty. He stated that he picked the room first and went to put his gear on the queen-sized bed and was surprised to see that it is dight behind him and she put her things on the bunk bed across from the bed he selected. His initial assumption was that she was going to stay in the other vacant room.  He had been to Horseshoe Ranch in advance to "scout" the property prior to the trip He did sit on her bed in his boxer shorts, but said that they had been talking and looking at each other's phone for pictures on Facebook.  The reason he was in his boxer shorts is because that is what he sleeps in at night, he did not bring night wear, he did not want to sleep in his clothing and assumed that he would be sleeping alone.  Sexual orientation came up while they were in their separate beds talking about the Orlando Shooting, at which time Bill says that sisclosed to him that the them got out of his bed, in his boxers shorts again and sat on her bed to show her his Facebook page and how he had changed his profile picture in support of the victims from the Orlando (gay nightclub) shooting.  Talked to about her earring, does not recall if he tried to touch the earring which was in her cheek.  They had dinner on June 17·2016, when they returned from Horseshoe Ranch, she selected a restaurant by her home, he paid because he makes more money than an intern, she had a beer and he took a couple of sip from her glass, then he dropped her off at home.  During dinner on June 17, 2016, he told that he enjoyed her company, thought they had a great connection, and that he really liked her. He suggested that they do dinner, play darts, have some drinks but his intention was that his wife and her boyfriend would also join them. He never suggested they smoke pot. SUMMARY FINDINGS				
Having had the opportunity to interview all of the witnesses, there appeared to be a common

	It was also noted that there was a pattern with the females who had issues with Bill Burger as they started out as an Intern with the Department. At times Bill was also involved in going to college campuses to help recruit interns.			
CONCLUSIONS				
Based on the facts uncovered during the interview and by Bill Burger's admissions that he:  Walked around the room in his boxer shorts,  Sat on bed while wearing just his boxer shorts,  Repeatedly asked out for dinner,  Communicated to that he felt they had a great connection, enjoyed her company and that he really liked her.  It is substantiated that Bill Burger's behavior and comments were inappropriate during the Horseshoe Ranch incident. In addition, based on the interviews, particular stated that Bill Burger grabbed her "rear end" on 3 separates occasions despite being told that is was not, "okay," also supports this inappropriate behavior.  It should also be noted that Bill has completed the following computer based training which

Administrative Misconduct Investigation - William Burger

This memo pertains to the sexual harassment allegation by William Burger against I which occurred at Horseshoe Ranch on June 13 – June 17, 2016. At the conclusion of the investigation it was discovered that there appeared to be a common theme that Mr. Burger does not demonstrate professional conduct and is often inappropriate in the manner in which he makes comments and touches his female peers. As a result of his conduct some of the female employees who he has direct contact with are having to arrange their schedules to ensure that they are not working alone with him out in the field.

One witness stated that Mr. Burger grabbed her "rear end," and although her comment to him was, "Dude, that is not okay," the witness states that Mr. Burger did not respond to her, and just "smirked". This same conduct happened on three separate occasions with this one individual and it was stated that he has done this to other females as well. Witnesses stated that Bill often becomes blatantly inappropriate with touching and his comments after work while they may be drinking around the camp fire.

Mr. Burger also admitted that he:

- Walked around the bedroom in his boxer shorts (underwear).
- Sat on bed in his boxers shorts on at least three occasions while they
  were at Horseshoe Ranch.
- Repeatedly asked out for dinner.
- Communicated to that he felt that they had a great a connection, he enjoyed her company and that he really liked her.

The behavior that has been consistently demonstrated by Mr. Burger has had a severe negative impact on female employees within the Department and is a great risk to Arizona Game and Fish Department and the State of Arizona. Based on the information gathered during this investigation, the following actions are recommended:

- Separation of employment for William Burger
   Harassment and Reporting Procedure Training for all supervisors within the agency
   Harassment Training program for all new Interns to be attended prior to going out in to the field
