**NARRATIVE**

On Thursday, October 1, 2015, at approximately 1921 hours, I was advised, by MCSO radio communication of an animal issue at the Lower Salt River, in the area upstream from Coon Bluff Recreation Area.

According to the call information, the callers, "Amy" and "Todd", a horse was located on the north bank of the river upstream of Coon Bluff Recreation Area and appeared to have been shot in the head.

Per the information received, and the fact contact was requested, I unsuccessfully attempted to contact "Amy" by cell phone. When I attempt to leave a message, the recording advised the voice mailbox was full. At that time, I contacted the second reporting party, Todd, and was unable to obtain contact with him as well. However, I was able to leave a message for a return call.

A short time later, I received a call from "Todd" who advised he had located the horse and had even examined the horse on scene. According to "Todd" a "twelve year old mare" was found deceased on the north side of the Lower Salt River; upstream from the man Coon Bluff Recreation Area. "Todd" advised during the process of examining the horse, per his concern he did not want the horse remains to contaminate the water, he dragged the horse further up onto the north bank of the river in an attempt to get the horse out of the water.

"Todd" expressed the reasoning for his concern for the horse's death was based on three holes in the head of the horse which Todd believed were bullet holes; indicating the horse had been shot in the head by unknown subjects. "Todd" expressed his frustration that the deaths / cruelty to the horses were not taken seriously and that the horses needed to be protected.

After being provided the location of the horse, I advised "Todd" it appeared the investigation would most likely fall under the jurisdiction of the Tonto National Forest or the Salt River Indian Community Police. In Response, "Todd" appeared to become increasingly frustrated and began expressing his frustration at his lack of confidence in the Forest Service and that he wanted the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office to look into the death of the horse; even making reference to the fact he could drag the horse to the south shore and further advising he did not actually get the horse onto the shore but that the horse was still in the water.

I informed "Todd" the incident would be looked into as soon as possible, however, due to the time of the day (darkness) he was reporting the incident, I would not be able to look for the horse until morning and that due to the low water level of the river at the time, utilizing a boat to locate the horse at that time would be dangerous and was not an option at that time of the day.

I assured "Todd" I would respond to the location first thing in the morning and look for the horse.

On Friday, October 2, 2015, at 0800 hours, I responded to the area "Todd" had described where the deceased horse was located. Upon my arrival at Coon

Bluff, I began walking east along the river bank for approximately 1000'. Upon reaching the area "Todd" had described, I observed a significant amount of vultures in the area, in trees and along the north bank.

Because I was unable to access the remains from the south shore, utilizing office issued binoculars, I began surveying the north shore line in the area where the vulture's main activity was noted. In doing so, I observed the remains of a large horse, significantly submerged, in the water, along the north river bank. Due to the body positioning of the horse, head to the east, I was only able to see the four legs and stomach area of the horse. Even with the use of binoculars, I was unable to see the head region of the horse. However, I was able to note, based on the condition of the horse hide, the horse appeared to have been in place for at least a couple of days.

Upon locating the horse, I contacted the Tonto National Forest Service and requested they respond to the scene to take disposition of the incident. A short time later, Tonto National Forest Service Agent R. Thies arrived on scene.

In speaking with Agent Thies, I briefed her on the details of the incident and provided her with contact information for "Todd". In response, Agent Thies advised me of a traffic accident which occurred on Tuesday, September 29, 2015, at about 0530 hours, in the area of Bush Highway and Goldfield Road in which a Tonto National Forest employee, who was riding a motorcycles, struck a large horse while on his way to work. After the collision, the horse ran from the area and the agent was taken to a local area hospital for treatment.

Due to the fact the potential existed the collision and the death of the horse could possibly be related this report was cross reference with the noted traffic accident (reference MCSO IR15-024934)

At that time, the case investigation was turned over to Agent Thies and the Tonto National Forest for disposition.

Note – later in the day (October 2, 2015), I was advised the determination made by the Tonto National Forest was to leave the remains of the horse in place and allow nature to take its course

<b>NARRATIVE</b>
<p>On 10-02-2015 a report was received that a dead horse was located in the river which had possibly been shot in the head. The Maricopa County Sheriff's Office Deputy M. Stedman # 1779 did locate the horse floating in the water which has GPS coordinates of 33-32-57 N by 111-38-33 W, and he was unable to see any possible gunshot wounds to the horse's head. On 10-06-2015 at approximately 1300 hours I was contacted by Sergeant C. Lafko # 479 of the Animal Crimes Investigation Unit and requested to respond to the Lake Patrol Sub Station and investigate this incident. I, along with Detective D. Daniel # 1822, arrived at the sub-station and met with LT. J. Bailey #1110 and Capt. R. Skinner #898 who requested that this unit investigate the remains of the horse in an attempt to determine if the animal had in fact been shot. I along with Detective D. Daniel # 1822 and Officer C. Huffman, of the Arizona Department of Agriculture Animal Services Division went on the river in the airboat piloted by Deputy A. Jackson # 1799, and Deputy J. Farnsworth # 1005, to the horse. Upon arrival at the horse I observed that it was in an advanced state of decomposition and had the skin slipping from the body. The horse was floating on the right side and there was a small puncture type wound located to the rear of the left shoulder. The head area had most of the skin missing and was showing some bone. I was able to secure the head with rope and pull it onto the front of the boat and the remaining skin was removed from the front of the skull area and checked for any holes. I was able to locate a puncture type wound over the right eye area with no other holes located. The head was removed from the body and retained for x-rays and further examination to determine if in fact the puncture wound is from a gunshot. The head was packaged in several plastic bags and transported to the Animal Crimes office and placed into the refrigerator and locked with a padlock, pending further examination.</p> <p>Nothing further at this time.</p>

<b>NARRATIVE</b>
<p>On 10-14-2015 at 1320 hours I met with the IL who is a volunteer with the Salt River Wild Horse Management Group and does work monitoring the horse herd and also educating the public regarding wild horses. The IL was working at Butcher Jones Recreation Area on 10-01-2015 and was contacted by Todd Renfrow who said there was a horse in the water and he needed help to move it out of public view. The IL returned to the horse in the water with Todd Renfrow and she waded across the river with Todd Renfrow and attempted to move the horse onto the bank out of public view. The two of them were able to move the horse closer to the bank but unable to completely move it onto the bank. The IL took photos of the horse's head while Todd Renfrow held the head out of the water so they could match it with photos of the horses which they have documented. The IL and Todd Renfrow left the horse in the water and checked the photographs of the horses and located the dead horse which is a 12 year old female named "Dotty". The photographs were taken on Todd Renfrow's cell phone and were given to Simone Netherlands, the president of the Salt River Wild Horse Management Group. Todd Renfrow said that he would attempt to forward the photographs to me.</p> <p>Nothing further at this time.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NARRATIVE</b></p> <p>On 10-14-2015 at 0600 hours I met with Todd Renfrow at the Coffee Star restaurant 4220 N. 7th Avenue Phoenix, Arizona to interview him regarding this incident. Todd Renfrow stated that he had joined the Salt River Wild Horse management Group in August 2015 due to his love for horses and to assist in the cause to save the horses from capture and possible being slaughtered by the government. Todd Renfrow said that he spends 3 days a week recreating on the Salt River and observing the horses. Todd stated that on October 1, 2015 at about 1100 hours he received a telephone call from Amy Done, another member of the group advising him she had located a dead horse in the river. Amy Done told Todd that she had seen the horse thru binoculars while looking along the shoreline and saw it floating in the water. Amy Done asked if Todd could respond to the river and perhaps drag the horse onto shore out of site of the public and also so it did not contaminate the water. Todd did go to the river on his lunch hour and he waded across the river which was fairly shallow at the time and viewed the horse Todd said he saw what he felt was three bullet holes in the head area as he had picked the head out of the water and propped in onto some debris in the water. Todd stated that he was unable to move the horse due to the size, and he said a prayer over the horse because he is religious and felt bad for the horse. Todd then went to the Butcher Jones camping area where he knew he would find Sarah Brewer as she volunteers her time educating people about the horses and also spends time with the horses. Todd and Sarah returned to the river and both of them went across the river to the horse where Todd held the horse's head out of the water and Sarah took photos. Todd and Sarah left the horse where it was and Todd e-mailed the photos to Simone Netherlands, the president of the group so she could get them to authorities. Todd said that he and Amy both contacted the Sheriff's Office and reported the horse. Todd said that he was told by Deputy Stedman that the Forest service had jurisdiction and the case would be turned over to them for investigation. Todd was asked if he had any suspects in mind that may be responsible or if anyone in the group may have a reason to cause harm to the horse and he said he had no suspects and no one in the group would hurt the horses. Todd said that if he locates any additional pictures of the horse in the river he will forward them to this unit.</p> <p>Nothing further at this time.</p>

<b>NARRATIVE</b>
<p>On 10-07-2015 at 1030 hours I contacted Doctor Nancy Bradley, DVM of the Arizona Humane Society to inquire if she would be available to perform an examination of the horse skull from this case. Doctor Nancy Bradley informed me that she and Doctor Alexandra Brower, DVM / Pathologist, of the Midwestern University College of Veterinary Medicine were enroute to perform a Necropsy on the horse body in the river. I asked Doctor Bradley who authorized them to do this and she stated that Kelly Townsend, a state representative had contacted the Midwestern University and asked that they perform a Necropsy on the horse carcass. Doctor Bradley said that she believed this had all been coordinated with this office to which I informed her that this was the first notification we had regarding them performing a Necropsy on the horse. I notified Sergeant C. Lafko # 479 of this information and he contacted Doctor Alexandra Brower to clarify this information. Sergeant C. Lafko # 479 arranged to meet Doctor Bradley and Doctor Brower at the Lake Patrol sub-station near Coon Bluff Recreation Area to coordinate the examination and Necropsy of the horse in the river. I along with Sergeant C. Lafko #479, Detective D. Daniel # 1822, and Detective D. Evans # 1947 responded to the sub-station to meet the doctors. Upon our arrival it was decided to attempt to move the horse to land if possible so at approximately 1130 hours myself and Sergeant C. Lafko were taken to the scene by airboat by pilots Deputy A. Jackson # 1799 and Deputy M. Multz # 1210. The horse was still where it had been since first observed at GPS coordinates 33 32 57 N by 111 38 33 W and floating with the left side exposed. The horse was secured to the airboat and floated across the river to a sandy beach area where I and Sergeant C. Lafko were able to drag it partially onto the beach area. I asked Deputy A. Jackson if he could use the airboat to cause a wake which would assist in washing the horse further onto the beach area. Deputy A. Jackson made two passes creating a wake which assisted in putting the horse further onto the beach area. The airboat returned to bring Detectives D. Daniel and Detective D. Evans to where the horse was on the beach area. At approximately 1230 hours Doctor Nancy Bradley and Doctor Brower arrived on scene as they were able to access the scene by motor vehicle and walk to the beach. Doctor Brower and Doctor Bradley made visual observations of the horse and then began the Necropsy. Upon completing the Necropsy Doctor Brower said that the horse was a female, well-nourished and had no visible external injuries nor did she find any internal injuries or other issues with the horse. Doctor Brower stated that she found nothing that would have caused this horse to die. The remains of the horse were left on the beach front to be disposed of.</p> <p>Nothing further at this time</p>
